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Jesse White honors woman for organ donation efforts

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ROCKFORD — Bobbi Smith knows about organ and tissue donation. She learned the hard way.

Smith, nurse manager of Rockford Memorial Hospital's Child Development and Behavior Department, lost granddaughters who were waiting for liver transplants in 1993 and 1994. When their youngest daughter, Carrie, died in 2002, she and her husband, Charles, donated her corneas and later started the Red Shoe Run to further encourage organ donations.

Smith said those experiences made organ donation her passion. Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White recognized her work Wednesday with a certificate of appreciation for her contributions to the state organ and tissue donation program overseen by his office.

White also presented a plaque to Kit Soper, nurse manager of the hospital's adult intensive care unit, recognizing Rockford Health System's efforts to encourage organ and tissue donation.

"The most important thing," Smith said, "is that we have started our donation committee so that there is much communication between Gift of Hope, which is our organ provider organization, and the hospital staff. We've improved communication and, therefore, improved the response the staff has to donation, and the support that we've gained is huge."

White said 5,000 Illinoisans are waiting for organs and encouraged anyone who hasn't registered as a donor since 2006 to do so with the First Person Consent Organ/Tissue Registry, which makes a person's decision to donate legally binding.

White also visited the driver's license facility in Belvidere, where he presented a countertop photo display of local resident Royal White, who received a liver and marrow transplant; Roscoe Village Hall, to present a similar display of local resident Michelle Vronch, who received her kidney from her sister; and the Rockford driver's license facility at 3816 Auburn St. to present a photo display of kidney recipient Tiffany Sago Gray.

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
